

Ohio Sales Tax Holiday



The State of Ohio has enacted a one-time sales tax holiday for the third year in a row that begins on Friday, August 4, 2017 at 12:00 a.m. and will end on Sunday, August 6, 2017 at 11:59 p.m. This sales tax holiday will be a great time to buy back to school clothes and school supplies. During this holiday, here is what is exempt from sales and use tax:

- **An item of clothing priced at \$75 or less.** There is no limit on the amount of the total purchase as long as each item is \$75 or less. Clothing includes all wearing apparel such as shirts, blouses, sweaters, pants, shorts, skirts, dresses, uniforms (athletic and nonathletic), shoes and shoe laces, boots, socks, underwear, stockings, coats, jackets, gloves, hats, belts, ties, scarves, baby blankets, diapers, formal wear and wedding apparel.
- **An item of school supplies priced at \$20 or less.** Such items would include binders, book bags, calculators, tape, chalk, compass, composition books, crayons, erasers, folders, glue, paste, lunch boxes, note books, markers, loose leaf ruled notebook paper, pencil bags/boxes, rulers, scissors, pens, pencils, etc.
- **An item of school instructional material priced at \$20 or less.** Some of these items would include reference books, reference maps/globes, text books, and workbooks.

Exempt items must be purchased separately from taxable items.

Items used in a trade or business are not exempt under the sales tax holiday.

All vendors must comply as the sales tax holiday has been set by the state.
